### Using APA style for your reference page

• All lines after the first line of each entry in your reference list should be indented one-half inch (1.27 cm) from the left margin. This is called hanging indentation.

 Authors' names are inverted (last name first); give the last name and initials for all authors of a particular work for up to and including seven authors. If the work has more than seven authors, list the first six authors and then use ellipses after the sixth author's name. After the ellipses, list the last author's name of the work.

### Using APA style for your reference page

Reference list entries should be alphabetized by the last name of the first author of each work.

#### Using APA style for your reference page

For multiple articles by the same author, or authors listed in the same ord er, list the entries in chronological order, from earliest to most recent.

### Using APA style for your reference page

• Authors' names are inverted (last name first); give the last name and initials for all authors of a particular work for up to and including seven authors. If the work has more than seven authors, list the first six authors and then use ellipses after the sixth author's name. After the ellipses, list the last author's name of the work.

- Present the journal title in full. For example, Architecture & Urbanism, not Archit Urban
- Maintain the punctuation and capitalization that is used by the journal in its title. For example: ReCALL, not RECALL or Knowledge Management Research & Practice, not Knowledge Management Research and Practice.
- Capitalize all major words in journal titles. For example: *Neuroscience & Biobehavioral Reviews*, not *Neuroscience & biobehavioral reviews*



#### Using APA style for your reference page

When referring to books, chapters, articles, or Web pages, capitalize only the first letter of the first word of a title and subtitle, the first word afte r a colon or a dash in the title, and proper nouns. Do not capitalize the first letter of the second word in a hyphenated compound word.
