Here the journal authors are the subject of the sentence.

3. Davis, Kesaru, Soskolne, Miller, and Stein (2013) found that prolonged use of mobiles places increases the risk of developing tumors to a great degree for those who have used their mobiles for more than 10 years and for those who begin using them before the age of 20 (para. 2).

Here the same journal authors as in example 3 are not the subject of the sentence.

4. Researchers have found that prolonged use of mobiles places increases the risk of developing tumors to a great degree for those who have used their mobiles for more than 10 years and for those who begin using them before the age of 20 (Davis, Kesaru, Soskolne, Miller & Stein, 2013, para. 2).

Here a shortened version of the title is used because the article has no author listed.

5. Researchers have reported that some British chiropractors have reported a new phenomenon: children becoming hunchbacked after extensive time spent hunched over their smartphones ("Children becoming 'hunch backs'", 2015, para. 7).
