
Post-reading

- Express ideas in your own words (paraphrase)
- Summarize to condense ideas
- Use learning and recall strategies



Paraphrase

- Read the sentence three times.
- Write what you remember in your own words.
- Go back and check that you have not changed the meaning.



Summarize

- Start with a sentence that states the author's thesis and includes the name of the article and author(s).
- Explain the author's most important main ideas in the order in which they appear in the original source.
- Compare what you have written to the article and to your notes to ensure you have not changed the meaning or forgotten to include a main point.

 - Topic sentence containing the title of the article, the authors, and the main idea of the article
 - 2. Supporting sentences listing the main points
