- aerospace (adjective) having to do with airplanes or spacecraft She wanted to become an aerospace engineer and design planes.
- anchor (noun) a weight on the end of a rope or chain that is dropped into the water to keep a boat from moving *They dropped anchor 400 meters offshore.*
- autonomous (adjective) able to operate independently or without the guidance of others

The people in this region want to be completely autonomous.

- battleship (noun) a large warship with heavy armor and many guns The battleship was sailing in the Arabian Gulf.
- community (noun) a social group sharing common interests
 She was given an award for her work with young people in her community.
- 6. **corroborate** (verb) to confirm or give support to something or someone *The witness corroborated Mr. Patton's statement about the night of the murder.*
- cultural (adjective) relating to the ideas, activities and behavior of a specific group of people

The country's cultural diversity is the result of taking in immigrants from all over the world.

8. **exhibition** (noun) - a show for people to see or learn about something, often at a museum

Have you seen the art exhibition at Dar Al Athar Al Islamiyyah?

9. **expedite** (verb) – to ensure that something takes place or is dealt with more quickly than usual

If you have wasta, you will be able to expedite the visa process.

- 10. **factor** (noun) element contributing to a particular result Losing his job is a major factor in Sam's current state of depression.
- 11. fetid (adjective) having a heavy offensive smell*The garbage had an fetid odor.*
- 12. founder (noun) a person who starts a business, group, company, and so on

Abdullah was the founder of the Business Club.

- 13. **image** (noun) a drawing or photograph *This picture is a horrific image of war.*
- 14. immerse (verb) to completely surrounding someone; to place someone fully into a certain environment*Living in Paris, he was completely immersed in the culture, so he learned French rapidly.*
- 15. **innovator** (noun) one who comes up with new and creative ideas Mark Zuckerberg was one of the innovators of Facebook.
- 16. interactive (adjective) having to do with back-and-forth "talking" between computers or people*The two departments need to be more interactive.*
- 17. participate (verb) to take part in an event or groupStudents are encouraged to participate in sports activities.
- 18. **philanthropist** (noun) a person who helps others through charitable activities *The philanthropist donated 5 million dollars to help refugees.*
- 19. preposterous (adjective) ridiculous*His claim to have invented hamburgers was preposterous.*
- 20. **renovation** (noun) a repair or improvement *The house is in need of complete renovation.*
- 21. response (noun) an answer*He remained silent and did not give me a response to my question.*
- 22. **simulation** (noun) a recreation of the appearance or characteristics of something *The scientists invented a machine for simulation of the conditions of space.*
- 23. subsidize (verb) to fundWe do not pay full price for a liter of petrol since the government subsidizes petrol prices.
- 24. **technology** (noun) tools and equipment developed from the application of scientific knowledge

Examples of technology are computers and smartphones.

- 25. **turret** (noun) a case that holds weapons in place on a warship *The gunner inspected the turret to ensure that there was a weapon inside.*
- 26. **virtual reality** (noun) technology that makes graphics seem real *The company uses a program based on virtual reality to train airplane pilots.*
- 27. **wreckage** (noun) the broken parts of something that has been damaged or destroyed *The wreckage of the two cars involved in the road accident has not been removed yet.*
- 28. yacht (noun) a boat with sails and sometimes an engine *I enjoy sailing on my yacht*.
