- 1. **adverse** (adjective) leading to unfavorable or harmful results (معاكس)

  We had to abandon the climb because of adverse weather conditions.
- 2. **allocate** (verb) to set aside for a special purpose (تخصيص)

  Four million dollars has been allocated to help the refugees.
- 3. **constraint** (noun) something that limits something else (تقبيد)

  These new laws place additional constraints on what newspapers can publish.
- 4. **copious** (adjective) abundant (وافر)

  Jill sat through the meeting and made copious notes.
- 5. **diagnostic** (adjective) having to do with finding a sickness or a problem (تشخیصي)

  We took a diagnostic writing test.
- 6. **entrepreneur** (noun) someone who starts a company, arranges business deals and takes risks to make a profit (متعهد)

Most people prefer working for someone else because it is safer than being an entrepreneur.

- 7. **exploit** (verb) to take advantage of something or someone for one's own needs or profit (استغل) Some employers sometimes exploit people who are poor and uneducated.
- 8. **integral** (adjective) essential, central or extremely important to something (أساسي)

  Adding acid to the chemical mixture is an integral step.
- 9. **intrinsic** (adjective) being an essential, natural part of something (جوهري)

  These problems are intrinsic to the situation.
- 10. **litigation** (noun) a lawsuit (دعوی)

  We had to go to court because of the litigation.
- 11. **mitigate** (verb) to make less intense or severe (تخفیف)

  Measures need to be taken to mitigate the effects of global warming.
- 12. **recurrent** (adjective) happening repeatedly (منكرر) *Measures must be taken to stop recurrent violence.*
- 13. **replenish** (verb) to fill or make complete again (سد النقص)

  The waiter replenished the water in our glasses.
- 14. **subsidized** (adjective) partially paid for by someone else, such as a government (مدعوم)

  The foreign car manufacturer could not compete against the subsidized prices of cars made in Korea.
- 15. **technique** (noun) a special way of doing something, especially one that has to be learned (أسلوب)

  She learned new techniques for creating special effects in films.
