

Week 5 Vocabulary List

1. **affinity** (noun) – a liking for someone or something (الانجذاب)
I felt an immediate affinity for my neighbors.
2. **centenary** (noun) – the 100th birthday of something (ذكرى مئوية)
A parade was held to celebrate the centenary of the country.
3. **choreograph** (adjective) – This word is usually used to indicate planning the dance steps; however, in this week's reading it means to plan in detail (يخطط)
The choreographed event proceeded without any flaws.
4. **debilitating** (adjective) – weakening; disabling (موهن)
I couldn't accomplish much last summer because of the debilitating heat.
5. **enmity** (noun) – hatred, ill will, or hostility between enemies (عداوة)
The enmity between the two countries eventually led to war.
6. **infamy** (noun) – a bad reputation brought about by something criminal or shocking (سمعة سيئة)
After the trial, his infamy resulted in the loss of most of his friends.
7. **neuromuscular** (adjective) – having to do with or affecting both nerves and muscles in the body (العصبية والعضلية)
My neuromuscular pain could only be relieved by medication.
8. **protract** (verb) – to stretch out, to be long, to drag out, to lengthen (أطال)
He took his time, even protracting the process over five years.
9. **recount** (verb) – to relate the details of or tell a story about something (سرد)
She recounted how she met her husband.
10. **tenaciously** (adverb) – stubbornly; not giving up easily (بإصرار)
The dog tenaciously refused to release the ball from his jaws.
11. **venerable** (adjective) – deserving respect because of age, achievement, or other notable qualities (مبجل)
The boys stepped aside so that the venerable old man could enter the room first.
