Summary: A brief statement that gives a clear idea of the main idea and main points of something.

Purpose

- 1. To improve reading comprehension
- 2. To briefly present the key points of a theory or work in order to provide context for your argument/thesis

Steps for Summarizing a Reading Passage

- 1. Preview the reading passage for title, subtitles, bolded and italicized words, and any pictures. In the margin, write a prediction next to the title, each subtitle, and picture regarding what you think this reading passage is about.
- 2. Next, read the passage one paragraph at a time, paying particular attention to the first sentence and last sentence in the paragraph.
- 3. In the margin, write a 1-3 word 'label' for the content of each paragraph.



Summarize individual sections of informational text

Read the section or group of paragraphs and add a <u>1-3 word</u> label to summarize what it's about.



ShamWow!

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- 4. Decide how the ideas in the labels are related. In the example above, all four labels indicate reasons why ShamWow viewers should buy this product. However, sometimes the labels should be grouped according to similarity. For example, if you were to read an article about COVID-19, your labels for the different paragraphs might be placed in three different groups: causes, symptoms, and treatments.
- 5. Write a sentence for each of the labels/groups.
- 6. Start your summary with a topic sentence¹. It should include the name of the author, the title of the passage, and the main idea of the piece. In the video ShamWow, Vince Offer claims that versatility is the reason why customers purchase ShamWow!
- 7. After you have written your topic sentence, write a supporting sentence² for each of your supports for the main idea.

¹ Topic sentence: The sentence that states the main idea of the paragraph. It is usually the first sentence in the paragraph.

² Supporting sentence: A sentence that talks about or explains the topic sentence. It does not include examples, statistics, or minor details.

- 8. End the summary paragraph with a concluding sentence³.
- 9. Compare what you have written to the ideas expressed in the reading passage, being sure that you have not changed the author's original meaning.
- 10. Be sure that you have used your own words throughout your paragraph. In the video ShamWow, Vince Offer claims that versatility is the reason why customers purchase ShamWow! ³ Concluding sentence: This is usually the last sentence in the paragraph. It can conclude the paragraph by paraphrasing your topic sentence.
